Minister Hunt has warmly welcomed our recent establishment of the Climate Science Centre, and is keen to see the broader research community support the centre as a collaboration hub. Our Minister is dedicating his early days to understanding our strategy and enhancing it by contributing his deep understanding of the entire system. It's great to see that Minister Hunt has a great personal interest in CSIRO.

I have been working closely with our Minister, the Bureau of Meteorology, and our O&A and L&W teams, alongside Alex and Hazel to further develop the Centre, and ensure that it supports our strategy of boosting Australia's prosperity and wellbeing. The Centre will help protect the marine and atmospheric environment and contribute to a safe, well prepared and responsive society, in deeper collaboration with Australia's 42 universities.

The 15 new members of Team CSIRO involving a \$37 million injection in climate science over the next ten years, was announced by our Minister and will focus on seasonal and decadal climate forecasting, which adds a new capability to our world-leading climate research.
